## ACCESS TO BASIC BANKING SERVICES

In Canada, every individual has access to basic banking services.

The Government of Canada put these regulations in place to make sure any individual can open a personal deposit account with a bank.

To open a PC Money™ Account, at one of our Pavilions, you need to provide one (1) item from Table A, or

Two (2) pieces of ID from Table B, or

One (1) piece of ID from Table B and one (1) piece of ID from Table C

### Table B

- A Certificate of Canadian Citizenship/Certification of Naturalization (paper form)
- Immigration Canada Form IMM 1000, IMM 1442 or IMM 5292
- A birth certificate issued in Canada
- A Social Insurance Number card issued by the Government of Canada
- An Old Age Security card (must bear the Social Insurance Number)

**Table C**

- An employee identity card issued by a well-known employer in the community bearing individual's photograph
- A bank or automated banking machine or client card issued by a member of the Canadian Payments Association (CPA) bearing the individual's name and signature
- A credit card issued by a member of the Canadian Payments Association (CPA) bearing the individual's name and signature
- A Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) client card bearing the individual's photograph and signature
- A foreign passport
- Identity is confirmed by a client in good standing with PC Financial or by an individual in good standing in the community where the pavilion is located.
